I can still hear her meek voice singing "and you pat it, you pat it, patty pat pat it" as she made dozens and dozens of tea cakes.

Those three finger imprints in each cookies spoke more than anything else I remember about my Maw Maw. Those fingers had hugged and helped 11 little grandchildren and numerous other neighborhood kids grow up, fingers that flipped through the pages of a tattered and used

Paw's hands for over 50 years, fingers that would clap
together and sing to make little babies dance a jig for as long as I can
remember. Those fingers were also out stretched to Jesus when the
Lord called her home. It was sad to watch her memory deteriorate
and her body grow weak. She became confused, and easily upset and
disoriented as time progressed, and the disease ravaged her mind.

We were all so upset to see someone who had so selflessly given of herself to so many other people now have to suffer with this terrible disease. But we never lost faith in the Lord because she taught us better.

Even when her mind and body were riddled with Alzheimer's, she never gave up her seat on the pew at church. I remember the Christmas celebrations full of homemade Christmas candy and delicious Thanksgiving meals full of family. She would sit on this white stool in her kitchen and talk with us, laugh with us and just love us.

R-22 (Freen) Phase-out:



In an effort to reduce consumer reliance on ozone-depleting substances, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA is phasing out the production of hydrochlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs). The release of these harmful chemicals into the atmosphere is eroding Earth's protective ozone layer, which contributes to erratic climate changes.

One of the targeted HCFC substances is R-22, a refrigerant used in air conditioners and heat pumps manufactured before 2010. Since this chemical will be obsolete by 2020, homeowners will be greatly impacted when servicing and repairing existing air conditioners.

Although consumers are not required to replace systems or convert units, as supplies of R-22 become limited, prices are already rising and Freon will eventually become difficult to obtain as stockpiled supplies dwindle. Additionally, only EPA-certified technicians will be able to reclaim and use the outdated refrigerant.

ENVIRONMENTALLY-FRIENDLY FREON ALTERNATIVES

New systems utilize alternative refrigerants that are eco-friendlier. The common replacement is **R-410A**, which is sold under a variety brand names, usually known as **Puron**. Carrier® proactively began using Puron in 1995, 14 years before regulatory requirements were enacted. Today, Puron sets the standard for high-efficiency residential and commercial cooling systems.



Since Puron is more highly pressurized, it cannot be used as a substitute for R-22 Freon. Simply put, it would be like converting a gas engine to run on diesel fuel – an impossible task without overhauling the entire system.

While you can convert the compressor, evaporator and condenser, it is more cost-effective to completely replace the HVAC system with one that is built to handle R-410A.

I grew up in a densely populated Czech region of Texas, Shiner to be more specific. **Kolaches** were a staple at family gatherings, bake sales, and almost any gathering where food was being served! Once I moved even an hour out of this area, I was often disappointed when I heard 'kolaches' were being brought for breakfast only to see what actually are sausage rolls or what Czechs call *klobasniky*. While sausage rolls are still delicious, they can disappoint a Czechs' mouthwatering nostalgia for the sweet fruit filled pastry. A traditional Czech kolache is a round or square-ish pastry made with sweet yeast dough, filled with fruit or cheese, and often topped with a crumble topping also known as posipka. Below is a recipe to make traditional Czech style kolaches. Warning... it's not for the weak willed baker! Recipe yields 2 ½ dozen kolaches.

SWEET DOUGH INGREDIENTS

¾ c. milk ½ c. sugar 2 tsp. Salt ½ c. butter or margarine ½ c. Warm water 2 pckg. Dry yeast 1 egg

4 c. all-purpose flour

FILLING AND POSIPKA TOPPING INGREDIENTS.
2-3 cans of favorite pie fillings

1 c. sugar
3/4 c. flour
1/4 c. melted butter
Poppy seed pie filling
Blueberry or cherry pie filling

3 pack of dry yeast

Sweet Dough - Scald milk, stir in sugar, salt and butter, cool to lukewarm. Combine water and yeast in large bowl. Stir until dissolved. Beat in milk mixture and egg. Add half the flour, beat until smooth. Stir in remaining flour to make stiff batter. Cover tightly and refrigerate dough at least 4 hours or overnight. Once ready to bake preheat oven to 350°F.

Posipka Topping - combine sugar, flour, and melted butter and mix until resembles coarse meal.

Punch down the dough, knead briefly, cover, and let rise in a warm, draft-free place until nearly doubled in bulk, about 1¼ hours. Punch down the dough again, knead briefly, divide in half, form into egg size balls, onto oiled cookie sheet and brush with melted butter and let stand for 10 minutes. Make indentions in center and fill with fruit fillings. Sprinkle topping on top of fruit filling, bake at 350° for 15-20 minutes or until slightly golden. While warm brush with melted butter and enjoy!
